
## **EXCELLENCE AT ST MARY'S by Rob Francis**

The afternoon was very well organised by Suzanna Widmer, who is a peripatetic teacher at the school. The venue, in the school's Music Pavilion, was a perfect setting for the afternoon lecture.

There were eight people attending, out of the ten who had signed up, and they all came from various professional backgrounds. Only one lady was a non-musician, but as a Reception class teacher was interested in the system and how she could use it in her teaching.
